





SISTER NORMA PIMENTEL


Norma Pimentel, a Sister with the Missionaries of Jesus, is the Executive Director of Catholic Charities of the Rio Grande Valley. She oversees the charitable arm of the Diocese of Brownsville, providing oversight of different ministries and services in the Rio Grande Valley through emergency assistance, homelessness prevention, disaster relief, clinical counseling, pregnancy care, food programs, and humanitarian relief to immigrants.

Sister Norma's work is one of immediate response to the emerging needs in the community. Her humanitarian work on the US-Mexico border overseeing the provision of a safe space for migrants to rest and regain strength, has been recognized by many organizations across the country.

She received her bachelor's degree in fine arts from Pan American University, a master's degree in theology from St. Mary's University in San Antonio, Texas, and a master's degree in pastoral counseling from Loyola University in Chicago.

In April 2023, Sister Norma was awarded the Spirit of Francis Award by Catholic Extensions in Rome, Italy for her humanitarian efforts in the Rio Grande Valley. Recently, Pope Francis also sent her a video message encouraging her and all volunteers to continue their work and efforts along the border.

With more than 25 years of experience and with his new TV show, “Better Human, Better Dog” now on National Geographic Title & Disney+; Cesar Millan is a household name and 3x Emmy nominated internationally acclaimed star of several hit TV series broadcasted and streamed in over 120 countries. A New York Times #1 best-selling author, and accomplished global public speaker, Millan is also an entrepreneur with an innovative product line including his widely

popular and exclusive training courses under his Training Cesar’s Way brand. Cesar Millan is one of the most sought-after authorities in the field of dog behavior and rehabilitation. He is the only world- renowned celebrity dog behaviorist and has taken it to another level with his mission through the Cesar Millan Foundation for better humans, better planet.

For Cesar, life should only be natural, simple, and profound, which is what you will find at his ever growing 43-acre paradise, the Dog Psychology Center in Santa Clarita. By understanding animals and nature, he has enabled himself to see humanity and understand all of its facets and complications. He’s learned so much about man by studying our best friend.

Cesar has grown into a pop culture phenomenon and a go to for many of today’s celebrities, athletes, world leaders, and entrepreneurs. From flattering parodies on “South Park” and “Saturday Night Live”; references on popular shows including “Jeopardy!” and “The Colbert Report”; and appearances on “Late Night with Jimmy Fallon,” “Dr. Oz,” “The Today Show,” “The View,” and “The Daily Show with Jon Stewart”; Cesar Millan can be found everywhere. 25 years into his journey, you will find Cesar only spreading more of his message and continuing to grow his massive social media following of over 19+ million people across the globe, adding new products under his belt, and launching more content across various platforms. 


2023 CHAIR'S AWARD

Mero previously co-hosted Showtime's WGA award-winning late-night talk show *DESUM & MERO* for four seasons. He also co-wrote the New York Times bestselling life advice book *God-Level Knowledge Darts: Life Lessons from the Bronx*, which was released by Random House in September 2020. Elsewhere in television, Mero has lent his voice to Comedy Central's *CRANK YANKERS*, ABC's *BLACK-ISH*, Netflix's *NEO*

YOKIO, and Disney's *STAR VS. THE FORCES OF EVIL*. On the film side, Mero starred in Netflix's *VAMPIRES VS. THE BRONX*. He currently resides in New Jersey with his wife and four kids.

PRISCILLA ORTA

Priscilla, who was raised by her grandparents, had always desired to be a lawyer. Priscilla remembers many summers when her grandmother would stop by the fields to offer farmworkers food and water. From her grandmother, Priscilla learned of her Mexican roots and her family's fight for respect and equal treatment; from her grandfather, she learned to value service to our country. Daniel was a proud Korean War Veteran who fought a decades-long battle against the VA due to his service-connected injuries.

In February of 2001, Priscilla's life changed forever when she earned an unofficial early admission to Harvard University. Priscilla participated in CHCI's Summer Internship class of 2002. That summer, she was blessed with peers who loved and understood her, as well as the opportunity to gain an insider's view of politics. After Harvard, Priscilla took part of the DCCC's campaign committee and was a DNC organizer in Kansas.

After working in politics and teaching for several years, Priscilla attended Columbia Law School and maintained high academic achievement. After graduating from Columbia in 2011, Priscilla clerked at the Harlingen Immigration Court—an assignment she specifically requested. By 2011, Priscilla knew that the Rio Grande Valley was her real home. Her two years with the Court reaffirmed the need for quality attorneys to take the hardest cases and fight the hardest fights.

Priscilla is currently the Supervising Attorney of Project Corazon, a division of Lawyers for Good Government. Project Corazon responds to the constantly shifting needs at the border by representing asylum seekers in MPP, providing remote Know-Your-Rights presentations, and serving the representational needs of the local RGV Community. Project Corazon documents conditions on both sides of the border and organizes lawyers to take action to improve the situation and create social change. Priscilla is honored to work with Lawyers for Good Government because it allows her to keep the promises she made to her grandparents forty years ago: She fights for justice, forces America to live up to its highest potential, and serves her country. It is an honor to fight for what is right every single day.

2023 CHCI YOUNG ALUMNUS AWARD

BLANCHI ROBLERO

Blanchi currently serves as Deputy Assistant Secretary for the Office of Legislation and Congressional Affairs (OLCA) in the U.S. Department of Education (ED). In this role, she provides strategic advice to senior leadership in OLCA, as well as build and manage relationships with Members of Congress and other agencies. She also directs and manages ED's team for political nominations, ensuring that the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) Committee advanced President Biden's nominees.

Previously, Blanchi was a Director at Penn Hill Group. She developed outreach and legislative advocacy strategies to identify key policy implications and challenges for organizations. She also developed, executed and conducted policy development and advocacy trainings as well as in-depth analysis of education proposals and policies to meet organizations' needs and goals.

During the Obama Administration, Blanchi served as Deputy Chief of Staff in OLCA at ED. In this role, she developed and implemented strategies for ED's outreach efforts with local, State and Federal stakeholders. Furthermore, she managed OLCA's role in a range of policy and funding areas, including appropriations, civil rights policy, higher education policy and other key policy issue areas.

Prior to joining the Obama Administration, Blanchi worked in the office of Senator Kirsten Gillibrand (D-NY), where she oversaw the Senator's constituent correspondence process. Blanchi is passionately engaged in advocacy efforts addressing immigrants' and women's issues in the education field and in growing her own expertise and experience. She completed a Gates Foundation-sponsored Graduate Public Policy Fellowship for the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute in 2012, where she worked both for Senator Chuck Schumer (D-NY) and at the White House Initiative on Educational Excellence for Hispanics on Federal policy matters directly impacting minority students.

Blanchi holds a master's degree in Education Leadership, Politics, and Advocacy from New York University (NYU) and two bachelor's degrees in Economics and Sociology from the City University of New York (CUNY), Hunter College.

BOBBY PULIDO

Jose Roberto Pulido Jr. better known as Bobby Pulido was born in 1973, in the city of Edinburg, Texas. He is the oldest child of Tejano legend, Roberto Pulido and Diana Montez, daughter of musician, Mario Montez, founder of Los Donneños.

Born and raised in Edinburg, he attended Edinburg High School and joined the school's mariachi group before joining his father's band, Los Clásicos, as their saxophonist and backup vocalist. He is a singer, songwriter, musician, and actor.

Since the release of his debut album “Desvelado,” in 1995, Bobby became an instant hit and was considered a teen idol to many across the United States, Mexico, and Latin America. In 1996, his album Enseñame, quickly rose on the Billboard Regional Mexican Albums chart, earning Bobby a nomination for the Tejano Music Award for Male Entertainer of the Year, and the Premo Lo Nuestro Award for Regional Mexican New Artist of the Year. In 1998, he performed to a sold-out Auditorio Coca-Cola in Monterrey, becoming the first Tejano musician to do so. He also went on to win Male Entertainer of the Year, three consecutive times.

As the accolades and awards continued, he has become one of the greats in Grupero/Regional Mexican music by being able to cross musical barriers on both sides of the border. As he has continued to grow as a musician, he continues to fuse his Tejano roots with country, Cumbia's and more.

In 2003, Bobby made his acting debut in the made for television film, La Decada Furiosa, he also appeared in the telenovela, Fuego En La Sangre, two years later he was part of Big Brother Mexico, and the live televised tribute concert, Selena Vive! that included numerous international musicians and singers playing tribute to Selena as well as participated in the album, Viviras Selena!

During his 27 years in the entertainment industry, Bobby has been nominated numerous times for some of the most prestigious music awards including Premio Lo Nuestro, Latin Grammys, Fiestas Mexicanas Awards and the Tejano Music Awards, winning many of these awards. He has also received several platinum records for his music.

LOS HERMANOS ROSARIO

Los Hermanos Rosario is a legendary Dominican music group that has been making music for over 30 years. They are arguably one of the most successful groups in the Latin music industry and have made a lasting impact on the Latin music scene. The group consists of three brothers, Miguel Angel, Juan Francisco, and Emilio. They were born and raised in Santiago de los Caballeros and started their career in 1988 with their first hit song 'Llego la Hora'. Since then, they have released many albums, some of which have gone multi-platinum. Their unique blend of merengue, bachata, and romantic ballads has made them a household name

in Latin music. They have collaborated with many of the biggest names in Latin music such as Shakira, Celia Cruz, Don Omar, and Wisin & Yandel. Los Hermanos Rosario have received numerous awards for their contributions to Latin music including two Grammy Awards and five Latin Grammy Awards. Their legacy lives on through their timeless songs that are still played at clubs and festivals around the world.

Los Hermanos Rosario has had an immense influence on Dominican music culture. They are credited with popularizing merengue music both domestically and internationally. They also helped bring bachata to mainstream audiences with their hit song 'Quisiera', which was released in 1994. Their influence can be heard in the music of many popular Latin artists today including Romeo Santos and Marc Anthony.

After over 30 years in the business, Los Hermanos Rosario continues to make timeless music that resonates with fans throughout Latin America. Their iconic sound and energetic live shows have earned them a loyal fan base that spans generations. Los Hermanos Rosario will continue to make history as they bring Dominican culture to the world through their unique style of music.
