Latinos and COVID-19: The Vaccine Phase

As Americans look with hope towards the end of the COVID-19 pandemic, Latino leaders have worked tirelessly to ensure our communities are adequately informed about the COVID-19 vaccine and that our families have equitable access to these life-saving treatments. Yet, in early 2021 less than a third of Latinos reported that they would elect to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, and many pointed to their lack of trust in the healthcare system as their reasons behind vaccine hesitancy. Democratizing Investing: Latinos and the Markets

The United States stock market has seen both steep losses and quick gains in response to the uncertainty surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, coming at a time when 52% of Americans have some level of investment in the market. Even as disruptive services in the financial sector seek to democratize investing, overall participation from Latinos in the market remains low: only 28% of Latino households are invested in the stock market compared to 61% of white households, and 10% of all Latino adults still remain unbanked while 22% are underbanked. Join a discussion with leaders in the financial services sector on how they plan to tap into the Latino community's economic power and enable one of our nation's largest demographics to take control of their financial futures.

Equitable Infrastructure for American Growth

Our public infrastructure connects, sustains, and defines the American community. Millions of people throughout the nation depend on our roads, bridges, ports, airports, and water and sewage systems, yet the American Society of Civil Engineers recently estimated that the United States has an unfunded infrastructure gap of more than \$2 trillion. This chronic lack of investment has had disproportionate impacts on low-income communities and communities of color, where inadequate resources and infrastructure have created physical, mental, and intergenerational harm. This session will highlight infrastructure initiatives that prioritize both equity and American growth, and how equitable investments in our nation's infrastructure will create opportunities for Latino communities and workers.


