#### ISABELLA CASILLAS GUZMAN



**Isabella Casillas Guzman** was sworn in as the 27<sup>th</sup> Administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration on March 17, 2021. **Claudia Flores** is the Associate Director for Immigration Policy and Strategy at American Progress. Prior to joining American Progress, she led the immigration policy portfolio for the National Latina Institute for Reproductive Health, where she worked on advancing federal and state legislation to expand health care access for immigrant children and families. She has worked with bipartisan leadership on advancing federal policy relating to matters of immigration enforcement and protections for immigrant youth. Flores has also written extensively on

immigrant contributions and the positive impacts of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program.

#### AMERICA FERRERA



**America Ferrera** is an award-winning actor, director and producer known for her breakthrough role as “Betty Suarez” on ABC’s hit comedy, *Ugly Betty*. For her performance, Ferrera was awarded a Golden Globe®, an Emmy®, and a Screen Actors Guild Award®, as well as ALMA and Imagen Awards.

Ferrera recently wrapped production on Season 2 of NETFLIX’s hit Latinx Dramedy, *Gentefied*. Described as a badass Spanglish series about family, *Gentefied* follows three Mexican American cousins and their struggle to chase the American Dream. The show will make its return later in 2021 with Ferrera returning as an executive producer and director.

Ferrera executive produced, directed and starred in NBC’s beloved workplace comedy, *Superstore*, which recently ended its six season run.

Ferrera will make her upcoming feature directorial debut with an adaptation of Erika Sánchez’s New York Times bestselling novel, *I Am Not Your Perfect Mexican Daughter*, for Netflix.

A longtime activist, Ferrera recently launched *Poderistas* alongside Eva Longoria Bastón and other Latina Leaders. *Poderistas* is a digital lifestyle community and non-profit built to inspire, affirm, and inform Latinas so they can leverage their power to transform their lives, their families, their community and their nation. As part of this organization Ferrera was integral in the Biden Campaign’s Latino Vote push in Florida and campaigned heavily in Georgia on behalf of the Senate Runoff. Ferrera is also a prolific speaker having spoken at major events such as Women’s March, the DNC, March for Our Lives, etc. She was also a chair for the Artists’ Committee for the Women’s March on Washington. Her activism has even extended on screen in several television documentaries including *Not Done: Women Remaking America* for PBS, the EPIX TV mini-series, *America Divided*, Showtime’s groundbreaking documentary, *The Years of Living Dangerously*, and Nicholas Kristof’s series for PBS *Half the Sky: Turning Oppression into Opportunity for Women Worldwide*.

### 2021 AMERICAN DREAM MEDALLION OF EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION, SCIENCE, MEDICINE OR CIVIL RIGHTS

#### SYLVIA MENDEZ



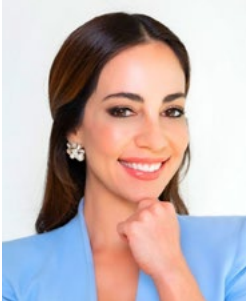
**Sylvia Mendez** is the oldest daughter of Gonzalo Mendez, a Mexican immigrant, and Felicitas Mendez, a Puerto Rican, who challenged segregation so that she and other Latino children could be provided the same quality education provided to white students. Her parents were plaintiffs in the landmark *Mendez v. Westminster School District* (1947) case that paved the way for *Brown v. Board of Education* (1954) and ended school segregation in California. In 1943 in Westminster, California, students of Mexican descent were required to enroll in segregated and inferior schools known as “Mexican Schools.”

When Sylvia was in the third grade, she and her brothers, Gonzalo, Jr., and Jerome, were denied admission to the “white” school near their Westminster home. The Mendez family, along with four other Latino families, fought to integrate the school. Mendez won in the Federal court in 1946, then again in appeal in 1947, and helped make California the first state in the nation to end school segregation. Seven years later, Mendez served as significant precedent for the NAACP in its US Supreme Court school desegregation case *Brown v. Board of Education*.

Miss Mendez and her family have received numerous awards and recognitions, including a US Postage stamp commemorating the 60th anniversary of the appellate victory; two public schools are named after Gonzalo and Felicitas Mendez; a Lifetime Achievement Award presented by the National Parent Teacher Association; and the US Congress Civil Rights Champion Award. On February 15, 2011, President Barack Obama presented Sylvia Mendez with the *Presidential Medal of Freedom*, the nation’s highest civilian honor.



## MARIANA ATENCIO



**Mariana Atencio** is an award-winning journalist, best-selling author and viral speaker, as well as the co-founder of “GoLike”, a premium multimedia production company specialized in motivational storytelling.

Her TEDx Talk on authenticity, “What Makes You Special?”, is one of the top 10 most watched on YouTube and translated into 13 languages. Her first book, *Perfectly You*, was an Amazon Best Seller and selected by Audible and AppleBooks.

Mariana’s experience led to “The Control Framework” and it’s notable ‘action items’ that she shares with top universities and Fortune 100 companies around the world.

A former national TV host for NBC and Univision, and expert on resilience & diversity, she has keynoted at the United Nations ‘Girl Up’ Summit, the LinkedIn annual conference alongside speakers like Michelle Obama, as well as flagship events for Microsoft, Citi, Spotify, UBS, Airbnb, Nasdaq, among many others.

She is featured in the award-winning HBO series “Habla” highlighting the Latinos defining the United States. Her work has been honored with a Peabody, a Columbia University’s “First Decade Award” and the National Association of Hispanic Journalists Presidential Award.





## JUANES



Multiple Grammy Award winning singer and songwriter **Juanes**.

With a solo musical career that spans 20 years, Juanes has evolved into a genuine superstar, one of the most celebrated pop figures in the Spanish-speaking world. He has released ten best-selling albums, garnered a dozen No. 1 singles, performed on the most important stages around the world, and amassed a combined total of 25 Grammys and Latin

Grammys. There are few accolades the singer-songwriter has not earned. This year has seen the release of Juanes' latest album *ORIGEN* – in which he passionately returns to his earliest roots in order to share a scintillating collection that reimagines some of the most important songs and artists that shaped his own early musical vision. With the album already hailed by *Billboard* as “*One of Latin music’s best of the year*,” Juanes is now set to embark on a new “Origin Tour” beginning tomorrow in Miami and continuing across the country throughout Hispanic Heritage Month.
