### **Clean Energy Transition:**

# Challenges and Opportunities for Communities and Industries

10:15 AM - 11:15 AM | The Regency Ballroom

As the U.S. continues its transition to clean energy, this session will focus on the opportunities facing both communities and industries, with particular attention to workforce development and preparing the next generation of workers for the green economy. Topics will include the transition from coal-burning plants to cleaner energy sources like geothermal, natural gas, and solar power, and the economic and social implications for affected communities. The session will also address strategies for retraining displaced workers, creating new jobs in clean energy sectors, and ensuring an equitable transition for all communities.

Additionally, the role of clean energy tax credits under the IRA, the need for increased research and development in clean energy technologies, and the importance of sustainable practices in transportation, such as electrification and the development of sustainable aviation fuels, will be explored. Industry experts and policymakers will discuss how to align workforce development programs with the growing demand for clean energy jobs, as well as approaches to maintaining local tax revenues and fostering innovation.
